Study questions for 1 Thessalonians 2v13-16

(Remember to find the answers in the verses under consideration!)

- V 13 What two key words are used three times each in this one verse? Did the apostles convince the Thessalonians with reasons to believe or just quoting God's Word?
- V 14 The NASB translation of this verse is incorrect and could lead one to believe that Jesus is not God, but just that God was in Him. Check the better translations: RV, ISV, KJV, CEV, JND, ASV & LITV. If the "Hebrew Christians" (cf. the title of the book of "Hebrews") in Judea were still "Jews", how could they be persecuting themselves? Is it possible to be a "Jew" and a "Christian" at the same time?
- V 15 Who "killed the Lord" and "not pleasing to God"? Is it correct to say that all "Israel" is condemned by this verse as Calvin and the Popes said?
- V 16 Why did the Jews hinder the apostles from speaking to the Gentiles? Could the "wrath" mentioned in this verse refer to the uprising that led to the destruction of Jerusalem in the year 70 AD?

Let's remember who are Enemy is, "not flesh and blood". Anti-Semitic groups attack the Children of Israel, while God says His warfare is with spiritual powers. Our weapons are not to be physical, but spiritual (cf. Ep6v12-18).
