This letter was <u>written</u> in the 60's AD since the style is that of an older person (not only named as an Elder) and there is no mention of Jerusalem's destruction in 70 AD.

The <u>writer</u> is John, identified by his use of the Greek language as well as historical testimony.

It is <u>addressed</u> to either a church (feminine image) or more probably a sister who was married.

There are five natural divisions :

vs1-3 An introduction vs4 Praise vs5-6 A new old commandment vs7-11 Warnings vs12-13 Conclusion

The \underline{key} words are truth (5x) and love (4x)

The <u>message</u> is in vs8

2Jn 1:8 Watch yourselves, that you do <u>not</u> <u>lose</u> what we have accomplished, <u>but</u> that you may <u>receive</u> a <u>full</u> reward.

The **application** is : keep both truth AND gracious love (agape).
