both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth."  Acts 1v8 NASB
1) You can be a good or a bad witness, but you <u>will</u> be a witness of what God can do in a life. What would a judge do to you if you said you wanted to be "a silent witness" in a court of law?
2) How can you be a good witness? How can you prepare to tell your story accurately?
"After they had <u>preached the gospel</u> to that city and had <u>made many disciples</u> , they returned to Lystra and to Iconium and to Antioch." Acts 14v21 NASB
3) Our part is easy since God alone can convict people of sin, righteousness and judgment. The Saviour alone can save! Why shouldn't we "argue people into receiving Christ"?
4) When should we "preach" (just announce the truth) and when should we "make disciples"? Why does Jesus say, "teaching them to obey all things I have commanded you" instead of, "teaching them all things I have commanded you"?
5) Of whom are we to make disciples? How does that differ from "mentoring", since the apostles led the people to the Lord and not to themselves? (cf. 1Cor1v13-15)
