The Letter to the Colossians

- 1. The writer : The style and the content resemble Ephesians and in addition the text (1:1) confirms that the apostle Paul wrote this book. He had never been to Colossi (Col 1:4, 9 & 2:1-4).
- 2. The date : Paul was in prison (4:3) with Aristarchus (4:10). He had some friends with him (1:1, 4:10-12) which was not the case in his last imprisonment (2 Tim 4:6, 9-12 & 16). The reason for his imprisonment (Ac 22:21-22 & Col 4v3) was because he preached the mystery of the Messiah of Israel to other nations (1:27). This imprisonment was in the year 60-62 AD. At first he was all alone in prison, but near the end he obviously had believers with him. So this letter was written near the end, in the year 62 AD.
- **3. The readers :** The letter was written to the assembly of believers in Colossi (1:2) but, was sent to be read to the assembly in Laodicea (4:16). Like the letter to the Ephesians also sent to the Laodiceans (4:16), this is a "circular" letter addressed to all of us.
- 4. The natural divisions : <u>Two aspects</u> to the mystery of "Christ in you". The Revelation - Col 1:1-2:5 (doctrinal truths) The Application - Col 2:6-4:18 (33 imperative verbs & 9 subjunctives)
- 5. The key repeated words : Christ (26x) & Him (20x)
- 6. The message : "Christ in you, the hope of glory" Colossians 1:27
- 7. The application : "You have been raised to life with Christ. Now set your heart on what is in heaven, where Christ rules at God's right side." Colossians 3:1 CEV
