Study questions for Ephesians 2v1-10

## (Remember to find the answers <u>in</u> the verses under consideration!)

- V1 Another natural division of this book can be seen by the use of the word "And..." which is a Greek word better translated here "But,..." as in Mt11v19 "...but, wisdom is justified..." The wonderful ending of chapter 1 is in contrast to the awful state of sinners. Why were they in such an awful state? What's the difference between trespasses and sins?
- V 2 Who leads unsaved people into sin?
- V 3 What other sources of temptation lead unsaved people into sin?
- Vs 4-5 Here is another natural division, marked by the word "But". The contrast is clear, between despair and hope. <u>How</u> does God save anyone? What's the difference between "mercy" and "grace"?
- V 6 <u>Where</u> is Christ today? He is a human being in Heaven, because God became a man! "We" already have a one foot in Glory, thanks to Him!!!
- v 7 When will God show His finished work?
- Vs 8-10 Always read these three verses together; since they are one sentence in any Literal Translation of the Bible. What is the chronological order of good deeds, faith and grace?
