Study questions for Galatians 2v15-3v29

Remember to find the answers in the verses under consideration!

v 15 <u>To whom</u> is Paul writing? (This is one of the most misunderstood passages in the Bible [Gal2v15-3v29] because readers do not pay attention to whom it is written. It is NOT written to all Christians. We are NOT all children of Abraham [3v7 & 29].)

vs 16-21 Why did God give the Ten Commandments? How does this force even a religious Jew to come to Christ for salvation? (v20 is a wonderful life verse for everyone of us!)

vs 1-5 What are the answers to the FIVE questions in these FIVE verses?

vs 6-12 When was Abraham saved and justified, before or after the Law was given to Moses?

vs 13-14 Where did Christ redeem both Jew and Gentile? (Notice that the "we" of v14 is written by a Hebrew Christian.)

vs 15-18 How many years before the Covenant of the Law was the Covenant made to Abraham?

vs 19-25 What was the reason God gave Moses the Ten Commandments?

vs 26-29 In order to end the pride of Hebrew Christians in Galatia, of whom does Paul say all Christians are children? (It is obvious that women are still different than men [v28] and physical children of Abraham are still Hebrew [v29], but we ALL belong to Christ.)
