Study questions for Galatians 6v1-18

(Remember to find the answers in the verses under consideration!)

V 1 This chapter speaks of several related ways to help one another. That means this verse begins a new natural division in the book. What is the first and most important way?

V 2 Rather than living selfishly, how does the Law of Christ command us to live?

What is the Law of Christ? (cf. 1Cor9v21, Jn13v34 & 2Jn1v5)

Vs 3-5 Although the Greek word "bear" is the same, the word "load" is not. If the "load" of our brother or sister is one that might "get him down", that does not mean we have the right to expect others to bear our "task or job". How can we know when not to expect help?

V 6 Who should financially help a teacher of God's Word?

Vs 7-10 The world tells us to "look out for number one". Where should we put our priorities?

V 11	<u>How</u> is Paul's example of taking the time to write, even when his eyesight seems to be bad, an example of what he has just written?
Vs 12	2-13 In summary of his whole letter, <u>why</u> does Paul say some Hebrew Christians want Gentile Christians to follow the Law given to Moses? (cf. The question for vs7-10!)
V 14	When is it good to boast?
V 15	This can be a difficult verse, as 1 Peter 3v15-16 say about Paul's writing, but what is he really saying by the word "nothing"?
V 16	Born again believers are the new creatures of v15 and according to 2Cor5v17. Who then is "the Israel of God"? (cf. Romans 11v5)
V 17	There is no other verse in the whole Bible that speaks of the "marks of Jesus". What do you think Paul might mean by this, since he asks that no one trouble him anymore ?
V 18	How will God help us this week?
