The book of Philippians

- 1. **The writer**: Saul of Tarsis, proud and zealous Israelite and member of the party of the Pharisee (3:5-6), was converted by Jesus (Ac9:5-6). He left all (3:7) and answered the call to be a missionary (Ac13:2-3). "Saul" (the big one) was then called "Paul" (the small one) since his first missionary trip (Ac13:9). Paul (1:1) went to preach the Gospel in the city of Philippi in Macedonia (Greece) in the middle of his second missionary trip (Ac16:12).
- 2. **The date**: The references to prison (1:7, 13-14, 2:12, 17, 4:14 & 22) and the hope of getting out soon (1:25-26 & 2:23-24) point to the first imprisonment of Paul during the years 60-62 AD, ten years after his first visit and the first converts.
- 3. **The readers**: All the Christians at Philippi (1:1 a) were meeting for worship under the oversight of the local elders (bishops) and with the help of deacons of the assembly (1:1 b). This is a typical Christian assembly, just like today.
- 4. Natural divisions: Six REASONS to rejoice together

Five prayers for the assembly, 1:1-11

Four forms of persecution, 1:12-30

Three exhortations to unity, 2:1-30

Two warnings, 3:1-4:1

One way to walk, 4:2-19

The blessing, 4:20-23

- 5. Repeated key words: You 66x, Joy 32x, Same 10x & Mind (Greek = φρονέω) 10x
- 6. **The theme**: The unity of Christians is a source of our joy: "Make my joy complete by being of the same mind $(\phi pov \hat{\epsilon} w)$, maintaining the same love, united in spirit, intent on one purpose." Philippians 2:2
- 7. The application: "Have this attitude (φρονέω) in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus."
